

REGENERATIVE AGRICULTURE PODCAST Advancing Eco Agriculture Farming For Generations

Tuesday, 2:00pm – 4:00pm

Join John Kempf, host of the Regenerative Agriculture Podcast and founder of Advancing Eco Agriculture, for an exploration of how Regenerative Agriculture can secure the legacy of our farms.

John will discuss novel ways of thinking about pest management, fruit quality, and soil health. He'll also introduce foundational concepts like the Plant Health Pyramid that explains how plants can increasingly resist pests as they become healthier. John believes that leaving a legacy means producing nutritious food that nourishes people and has lower pesticide requirements. It also means ensuring our farms' profitability and providing a joyful, stable livelihood for the next generation. He'll show how regenerative practices can achieve all of those goals.

Keynote: The Untapped Bounty of Regenerative Agriculture Wednesday, 9:00am – 11:00am

John Kempf, host of the Regenerative Agriculture Podcast and founder of Advancing Eco Agriculture, sees no shortage of reasons to be hopeful about the future of farming. He'll deliver an inspirational address about the opportunities of regenerative agriculture to enhance a grower's lifestyle and bottom line.

John will particularly zero in on the opportunity to improve harvest quality. The reality is that 35-40% of fruit on the tree is never sold because it drops or is graded out due to poor quality. He'll describe how regenerative practices can improve fruit quality, reduce drops, enhance grade, and have an immediate impact on a farm's bottom line. Moreover, managing for quality can make orcharding and farming more *fun*. John Kempf will show you how.

Managing Nutrition for Fruit Quality and Pest Resistance Wednesday, 12:00pm - 2:00pm

Following up on Tuesday's session exploring the principles of regenerative agriculture, John Kempf will dive deep into the actual practices that can create plants capable of resisting pests and diseases without pesticides, while building healthy soils and growing nutritious produce.

John will describe how a data-driven understanding of plant nutrition leads to very different management of NPK fertilizers and micronutrients. He'll also explain how to use Sap Analysis as a tool to manage plant nutrition in real time and apply targeted nutritional applications through foliar sprays.

For anyone interested in improving the quality of their fruit and produce, reducing their use of pesticides and synthetic inputs, and generating more profit, this session is not to be missed.

LUNCH: WELCOME FOOD TRUCKS



- There are many articles written about the education at Expo. Now, many of these articles have links to direct you to them from the Expo website.










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CIDER CONTEST

- Cider contest judging will be on Wednesday afternoon.






